TERMS & CONDITIONS

By completing and submitting the 2010 National NAIDOC Poster Competition Entry Form, each participating artist agrees to be bound by the following terms and conditions of entry:

- 1 The artwork must reflect the 2010 NAIDOC theme: **Unsung Heroes – Closing the Gap by Leading Their Way**
- 2 All participating artists must be Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander people.
- 3 The artist must be an individual. No group entries will be accepted.
- 4 The artist may submit only one artwork (entry) in any of the following four ways only:
 - * By submitting a completed Entry Form via **e-mail** (info@naidoc.org.au) and attaching to the email a digital photo or subsequently posting a print/image (at the applicant's own expense and risk) to:

 - * By submitting a completed Entry Form **online** via <http://www.naidoc.org.au/> attaching an image of the artwork or subsequently posting a print/image to the above address at the applicant's own expense and risk.
 - * By submitting a completed Entry Form via registered **post** with a print/image to the above address at the applicant's own expense and risk.
 - * By submitting a completed Entry Form via registered **post** with the original artwork at the applicant's own expense and risk.
- 5 If a photo version of the artwork is short listed by the judging panel, the artist will be required to mail in their artwork at their own expense and risk for judges to make a final decision.
- 6 The Commonwealth of Australia (the Commonwealth) as represented by the Department of Families, Housing, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs (FaHCSIA), accepts no responsibility and disclaims all, or any, liability for any loss or damage incurred by any person, whether directly or indirectly, as a result of postage, delivery or handling of original artwork. The artist must pay return postage or freight costs and the Commonwealth as represented by the Department of Families, Housing, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs (FaHCSIA) will return entries only if prepaid postage or freight is forwarded with the entry. Entries not otherwise collected by 1st September 2010 will be disposed of at the Commonwealth's discretion.
- 7 A completed Entry Form signed by each artist **must** accompany the artwork to indicate agreement to these terms and conditions.
- 8 All participating artists warrant that they are over the age of 18, that the artwork submitted is original work, the artwork submitted has not been the recipient of a major prize before and that they have not charged or otherwise encumbered the work nor given any assignment inconsistent with these terms and conditions. Where an artist is under the age of 18, the artist's adult parent/guardian must complete the Entry Form by stating their own name on behalf of the name of the artist to indicate their agreement with these terms and conditions on behalf of the artist.
- 9 All participating artists undertake to indemnify and keep indemnified the Commonwealth as represented by the Department of Families, Housing, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs (FaHCSIA) against all claims, demands, losses and damages that the Commonwealth as represented by the Department of Families,

Housing, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs (FaHCSIA) incurs as a result of a breach of any warranties and obligations given by Entrants under these terms and conditions.

- 10 Artwork should be no larger than A1 (594mm x 841mm) and should not be framed or mounted behind glass.
- 11 An award of **\$5,000** will be offered to the winning Entrant. All entries will be viewed and judged by a subcommittee of the National NAIDOC Committee. The decision of the judges will be final and absolute. No correspondence about the decision will be entered into.
- 12 Property rights in all unsuccessful submissions will remain with the artist or Entrant; however the Entrant is responsible for payment of return postage and/or freight costs and to include this with the entry submission.
- 13 By signing a completed Entry Form, and accepting the award offer, the winning artist:
 - * agrees to grant royalty-free, worldwide, non-exclusive licence to reproduce and publish work in all media of expression now known or later developed and in all languages in the winning artwork to the Commonwealth as represented by the Department of Families, Housing, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs (FaHCSIA) without reservation including, but not limited to, all intellectual property rights to reproduce and publish the winning entry on the official 2010 National NAIDOC Poster and to change and/or reproduce any part of the winning poster in relation to other promotional activities;
 - * agrees that the Commonwealth as represented by the Department of Families, Housing, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs (FaHCSIA) may publish, on the 2010 National NAIDOC Poster and in relation to other promotional activities, any personal information provided by the winning artist in connection with their entry including, but not limited to, the winning artist's name, age, community and State/Territory of residence; and
 - * warrants that there is no cultural or religious reason or any other impediment that prevents the winning artwork from being exhibited, published or reproduced.
- 14 All property rights in the winning submission will remain with the artist, except as provided by these conditions. It is a condition of entry that entrants grant the Commonwealth as represented by the Department of Families, Housing, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs (FaHCSIA) royalty-free, worldwide, non-exclusive licence to reproduce and publish work in all media of expression now known or later developed and in all languages. Requests for permission to reproduce published Commonwealth copyright material should be directed to the Commonwealth Copyright Administration, Copyright Law Branch, Attorney-General's Department, National Circuit, Barton ACT 2600. Once permission is received from the Attorney General's Department to reproduce the winning submission, any reproduction must acknowledge the original artist of the submission and the National Aboriginal Islander Day of Celebration (NAIDOC). Any reproduction of the winning submission outside of the National Aboriginal Islander Day of Celebration (NAIDOC) must be in full; permission for partial reproductions of the artwork will not be granted.
- 15 All entries must be received by close of business on Wednesday 31st March 2010.
